Adrian Anderson is employed on a part-time basis as acting Chief Executive of the University Vocational Awards Council (UVAC). UVAC is the higher education representative organisation for UK higher education institutions, FECs delivering HE and others such as LLNs committed to championing higher level work-based learning and progression to HE from work-based and vocational level 3 programmes. Established in 1999 by the HE sector for the HE sector, with a membership of over 100 institutions/partners, UVAC is an active advocacy body, has published over 20 reports which focus on recognising and supporting work-based learning in higher education; the use of APEL and National Occupational Standards; work-based and vocational progression to HE; and good practice in work-based learning. Adrian is also a director of HE@Work, the HE/employer engagement consultancy established by Edge and UVAC. Before joining UVAC, Adrian Anderson was the director of policy and development of NTO National Council (the representative body for National Training Organisations).
